



Modern Slavery Act Statement

This statement from Quantum Commodity Intelligence has been prepared in line with the UK Modern Slavery Act 2015. It is intended to show the ways in which the company works to prevent the use of human trafficking and modern slavery in our business and among our suppliers.

What we do and how we work

We are a provider of news and price data for energy and commodity markets. A single, director- and employee-owned entity, we take matters relating to slavery seriously and will do everything within our power to ensure it plays no part in our work.

What our policies are

Our work requires staff and contractors to attest to and work in line with our code of business ethics as well as to adhere to the company's core values. When joining the company, all directors and staff have been made aware of the Modern Slavery Act as well as matters associated with modern slavery, how to spot it, and how to flag potential risks. Any matter relating to modern slavery flagged by staff, customers, or suppliers will be treated in confidence and with the highest priority. It will be fully investigated and appropriately dealt with to ensure slavery plays no part in our work.

How we work with suppliers

We are committed to making sure modern slavery plays no part in any part of our business, either directly or tangentially. While we consider our business risk to be low due to the nature of our work, thorough and proportionate due diligence into the work of our suppliers is conducted prior to entering a business relationship.

How we have done and what we will do

Over the past nine months, Quantum has:

- Made all staff aware of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and informed them of the appropriate action to take if they suspect a case of slavery or human trafficking.
- Ensured procurement strategies and contract terms and conditions include references to preventing modern slavery and human trafficking.

Quantum received no reports from employees, the public, or law enforcement bodies to indicate modern slavery practices had been identified.

In 2022, Quantum will:

- Continue to work to raise awareness of modern slavery by reviewing and evaluating the measures and processes that we have implemented so far to ensure their effectiveness.
- Work with our suppliers and customers and review our processes with our partners to identify additional measures we can take as a business to combat modern slavery and human trafficking.

- Continue to develop staff on the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and reporting mechanisms if a case of slavery or human trafficking is suspected.
- Make information available to businesses to inform them of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and the appropriate action to take if they suspect a case of slavery or human trafficking.
